Nursery and Reception looked at how to use technology responsibly and respectfully.



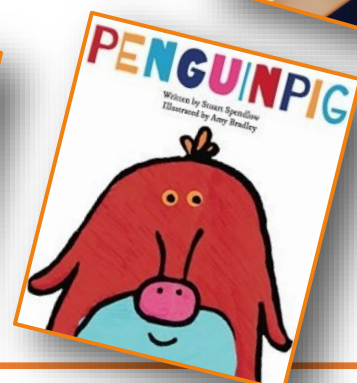
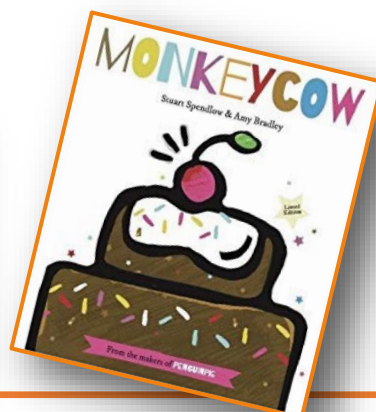
They brought in some of their electrical toys from home to explore as well as using bee bots, iPad and computers in the classroom.

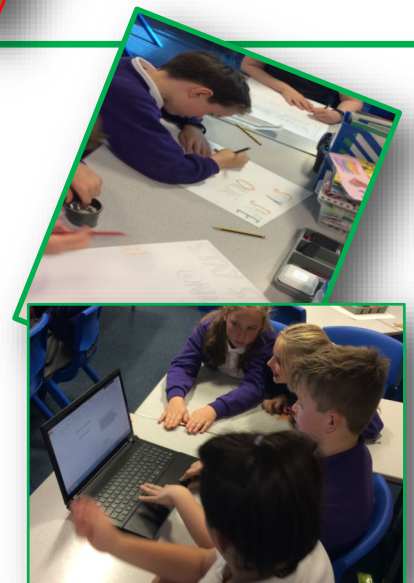
